

What is a 252 Award?

The 252 award scheme allows archers to test their skill at increasing distances, starting from 10 yards, all the way up to 100 yards. The premise is straight forward – to qualify for a 252 award for a particular distance, as a Recurve archer you must score 252 or more with three dozen (36) arrows using 5 zone scoring , on two separate occasions.

Although the award is called the 252, the score that you need to achieve is different for the bow types other than Recurve. The scores for the different bow types are as follows:

Compound	Recurve	Barebow	Longbow
280	252	189	164

How do I go for a 252 Award?

If you want to shoot a 252 round, there are a few simple rules to follow:

- Six sighters are allowed for each round.
- You can't submit more than one 252 round score per day.
- Only the first shoot of a day can be submitted for a 252 round.
- A 252 round must be witnessed by a fellow archer.
- Normal AGB rules of shooting apply.

To submit your 252 score you can either use one of the dedicated 252 score sheets in the scoresheets folder, or you can enter the score directly into Golden Records online. For the paper scoresheet you'll need to sign your sheet and also have the witnessing archer sign. For Golden Records, enter the witnessing archer's name in the 'Notes for Records Officer' box.

Once you have entered two eligible scores for a particular distance and would like to claim your badge, please notify the records officer at <u>records@wellscityarchers.com</u> and put £2 in an envelope with your name (and scoresheets if scored on paper) and pop the envelope in the 252 postbox in the clubhouse. The records officer will then notify you by email as soon as your badge is ready to collect.
