

Club Rules

1 Introduction

This document details the rules that specifically relate to Wells City Archers (hereinafter called the Club). These rules are determined and can be changed by the Club Committee. All changes will be notified to members.

2 Outdoor range

For all bows shot off the fingers

You may shoot:

Up to and including 60 yards on all 8 lanes

Up to and including 70 yards on lanes 3, 4 and 5 only

Up to and including 80 yards on lane 4 only

If you are shooting in lanes 1, 2 or 3 you are required to have another adult with you who does not shoot at the same time as you, and acts as lookout. As our overshoot area extends sideways beyond the fence - if anyone enters the area within 5 yards of the fence line you must cease shooting immediately. It is therefore recommended that you shoot mainly on targets 4, 5, 6, 7 or 8 if possible.

Compound bows shot with release aids are not allowed on our field.

When you are shooting on the outdoor range you **MUST** take the flag (windsock) with you, and ensure that it is flying for the duration of your shooting. When you finish, if you are the last one on the field, remove the flag and replace it in the clubhouse.

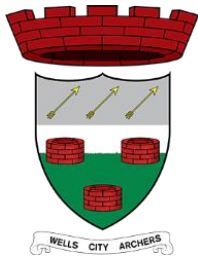
The flag is stored in the entrance lobby. The poles slot into each other, and the ends are colour coded - so just match the colours as you put it together.

The flag then slots into the tube on the fence post by the entrance to the range.

3 Indoor range

Should the ceiling of the range become damaged by an arrow, please follow this procedure :

- Do not touch the roof material or debris
- Do not retrieve your arrow
- Leave the range immediately
- Stop other people entering the building
- Close all doors behind you
