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NOTES

- 1 Activities described 'per year' means each year starting on the anniversary of renewal.
- 2 Informal mentoring is not part of a formal training program. Where the coach is learning by receiving mentoring from a more senior or experienced coach. The mentor should be listed as a referee and the relationship should extend over 4 months duration.
- 3 The period of working with sports specialists should cover at least two events of 2 hours such as a squad session or similar.
- 4 A sports specialist is defined as a person degree qualified in a sports science and a sports professional as a full time employee.
- 5 The work with a more senior coach shall comprise working at a 'structured' event such as performance workshop or squad ETC.
- 6 A small amount of non-archery specific CPD may be claimed. Please explain their relevance to archery, where content may not be obvious.
- 7 A published paper should be substantial and original work, made generally available, 2000+ words possibly supported by a power point presentation which outlines a basic concept or problem, discusses it and leads the reader to a specific conclusion from which they can learn.
- 8 Workshop sessions contained within the programmes of a conference or seminars do NOT attract CPD points in addition to the points allowed for the whole event.

- 10 Even if multiple Technical Framework workshops have been attended, only claim points for one
- 11 Points for Self Directed Learning should not be more than 25% of the minimum points required for renewal
- General Working as National / Regional / County Coaching organiser is included in this section.
- Note Working with a junior archer toward the attainment of GCSE or Duke of Edinburgh award scheme with archery can qualify for CPD points. The individual level of involvement should be discussed with renewals verification from a teacher or DofE. Administrator.
